GOAL 2: SUCCESS FOR EVERY STUDENT

Outcome: More students achieve a minimum of one year's growth in literacy and numeracy.

SCHOOL GOAL 1

More students will achieve a minimum of one year's growth in reading and written expression.

STRATEGIES/ACTIONS IMPLEMENTED:

Strategies:

- 1. Uncas will continue its substantial commitment to Leveled Literacy program this year targeting students who have been determined to need extra help via the benchmarking tool Fountas and Pinnell. We only have sufficient enrollment for one kindergarten class this year and that teacher has done LLI work in the past and is very effective. 0.5FTE of her time will be allocated to LLI.
- 2. All needed kits have been obtained including gold, blue, red, green and orange.
- 3. The Readers Workshop kits have been purchased for all grade levels.
- 4. 100% of staff is embracing Lucy Calkins' Readers Workshop.
- 5. Just over \$15,000 has been spent in the 2019-2020 school year on books to support Readers Workshop.
- 6. Teachers will additionally attend grade specific collaborative planning groups with Literacy Consultant Heather Balog when it becomes available.
- 7. Six of the eight classes are using Raz Kids to support learning.
- 8. Teachers have expressed interest in Writer's Workshop as professional learning becomes available.

- 1. The use of the STAR Assessment tool will identify students for interventions.
- 2. It is hoped that 95% of students identified for literacy interventions will receive one year's growth as stated in division and school goals upon reassessment using the benchmarking tool.
- 3. It is hoped that assessment results throughout the ELA courses will continue to show improvement as well as carryover into all subject areas as literacy affects all learning.
- 4. It is also hoped results maintain or improve on already very strong PAT results.
- 5. The Accountability Pillar and Parent Survey tools will indicate maintenance and improvement of results.

EIPS PRIORITY: Priority 1: Promote growth and success for all students.

GOAL 2: SUCCESS FOR EVERY STUDENT

Outcome: More students achieve a minimum of one year's growth in literacy and numeracy.

SCHOOL GOAL:

School Goal 2: More students will achieve competency in problem solving and higher order thinking in mathematics.

STRATEGIES/ACTIONS IMPLEMENTED:

- 1. The MIPI benchmarking tool has been used to identify student's levels and abilities. This information is then used to intervene via pullouts with educational assistants to work on missed concepts.
- 2. Elk Island Public Schools consultant is providing Coaching and modelling to administration, grade groups and individual students.
- 3. Specific programming includes Number Talks, Guided Math Framework, The CSL Math benchmarking kit and Equals Math kit.
- 4. Uncas Elementary School uses the computer program Mathletics to support delivery of curriculum.

- 3. It is hoped that assessment results throughout the mathematics courses will continue to show improvement as well as carryover into other subject areas such as science.
- 4. It is also hoped quantitative results maintain or improve on already strong PAT results.

 The Accountability Pillar and Parent Survey tools will indicate maintenance and improvement of qualitative results.

EIPS PRIORITY: Priority 2: Enhance high quality learning and working environments.

SCHOOL GOAL:

<u>School Goal 3:</u> Fostering a community that promotes positive relationships, instills creativity, and maintains a safe and caring environment for all learners.

STRATEGIES/ACTIONS IMPLEMENTED:

- 1. A firm, consistent expectation of positive citizenship and kindness has shown to be successful over the past two years overcoming substantial former behaviours.
- 2. Outcomes of disciplinary discussions are focused on correction of behaviour over, but not exclusive to punitive consequences. This has been effective and will continue.
- 3. There will be continued emphasis on bullying and citizenship. Counsellor Dianna Graziano will lead Bully Awareness Week 2020, in late November.



4. If health and safety protocols allow Mr. Kennerd will again request Parent Advisory purchase sessions from Saffron in Sherwood Park to address bullying and Internet Safety.

- 1. Observable measures. Staff reports so far results have been very positive and the incidents of misbehavior are largely mitigated.
- 2. The incidence of behavioural suspensions is down from last year.
- 3. Data on the Accountability Pillar showed improvement last year and it is hoped to continue to show improvement.

Reflecting on your data, what was your greatest success?

The data indicates our greatest success is perhaps the most important indicatorw, Safe and Caring Schools. The previous 3 year average is 86.8% and the result last year was 89.4%. While teachers and parents consistently give high results for this category, the students perception is often not as strong. This number can never be high enough and continues to be a focus.

Reflecting on your data, what was your greatest opportunity for growth?

I will identify 2. The first is Citizenship. It went from 83.7% the previous year to 78.9% this past year. The sample size is small which while it may be a factor can not be ignored. Classroom discussions with students will take place in the new year with citizenship issues as a focus. Professional judgement can discern that citizenship is actually quite high but the student's perception needs to be analyzed.

The dive in parental involvement data is a surprise. Small sample size can be a source of inflation and deflation. The previous year's result at 92.8% was an anomaly as is last year's result of 76.3%. There remains very good communication and cohesion between parent council and Uncas staff. Again a deeper dive into possible sources of discontent needs to be explored. This can occur through discussions at PAC meetings and or one on one meetings with parents.

Another possible factor is the Facebook page which began last year. School participation on this social network has been minimal and best practices will be explored through EIPS Communications.
