Strategy

STRATEGIES:

- We have been a member school in the EIPS-Mental Health flagship Group in the past. This group emphasizes restorative practices and continuing to build a school community. We will continue the work this group started.
- In the past Uncas Elementary was fortunate to work with the Mental Health Capacity building program sponsored by the County of Strathcona. Mental Health Capacity Building works with students and staff promoting positive mental health and strengthens social-emotional skills in children, youth and families through awareness, knowledge and skill building. We will revisit this work and its learnings about the brain and strategies to manage emotions.
- A firm, consistent expectation of positive citizenship and kindness will continue to be an area of focus. Outcomes of disciplinary actions are focused on correction of behaviour over, but not exclusive to punitive consequences.
- There will be continued emphasis on bullying and citizenship. Counsellor Dianna Graziano will lead Bully Awareness Week 2025.
